MEA chief executive Officer Robyn Johnson said the business events industry is a growing economic contributor to regional communities and the partnership is a reflection of the close relationship with the NSW Government.

"We are thrilled to be collaborating with the NSW Government to bring more job opportunities into rural and regional NSW," she said. "I also look forward to meeting with the Destination Networks this year to work together to grow business events across the State."

The course will be delivered via MEA's online learning tool allowing students to complete the tasks at their own pace and in their own time.
